From November 27 to January 3 in the historic DeGolyer House, lavishly decorated for the holidays, The Artistry of the Nativity collection returns with 300 crèches, representing so many cultures from around the world. In addition to the Ray Harrington Collection, which the Arboretum owns, the collection of George Dvorsky will be showcased. Mr. Dvorsky's long career on Broadway and a lifetime spent traveling has allowed him to amass a collection of unique and collectible crèches from around the globe.
