Summer at the Arboretum Featuring Lyman Whitaker: Wind Sculptures in Motion May 26 through July 31

The Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Garden invites locals and visitors to spend summer at one of the top "15 Breathtaking Botanical Gardens in the World," according to *Architectural Digest*. With the ever-changing explosions of colorful blooms, Wind Sculptures in Motion: The Kinetic Art of Lyman Whitaker, the largest outdoor sculpture collection in a public space; a shaded Pecan Grove perfect for picnicking, live music and family friendly activities every weekend; Summer at the Arboretum creates a memorable experience for all ages.

Presented by Reliant, Wind Sculptures in Motion: The Kinetic Art of Lyman Whitaker, is on display throughout the gardens through July 31. Each piece of Whitaker's artwork is organic in nature and responds to the changing currents of the wind, which provides its special movement. Whitaker hand-produces these innovative sculptures with a high degree of mechanical integrity and quality craftsmanship. The sculptures range in height from five to 27 feet, and 140 sculptures are arranged artfully in groupings throughout the garden for viewing.

Dave Forehand, Dallas Arboretum's Vice President of Gardens, said, "Art and the gardens go hand-in-hand with this breathtaking nature-inspired exhibit. Don't miss the unique opportunity to see the beautiful movement these wind sculptures create set among the beautiful floral back drop of the gardens.

He added, "In the gardens, the beds are bursting with plants full of blooms like ageratum, impatiens, petunias, cleome, begonias, salvia, marigolds and zinnias. As the temperatures

warm, caladiums, sunpatiens, lantana, pride of Barbados, variegated tapioca, elephant ears, and coleus will be added to the gardens."
